

In short order it was sold and was sent to the manufacturer for production.


In early June our order was delivered and the city of Williston employees helped us unload and move it to storage.

Sales begin a few days later and six weeks later, we're happy to report, it is selling well.

The game is \$25 per unit but if you buy five or more units, the cost is \$16 - that's like getting one for free.

Besides needing one for your home, how about these ideas:






